An introduction to training with the electronic collar and how to teach a really reliable retrieve

with Doug Grant and Anne Everett

Nov 5-6, 2011

This work shop will cover how to teach a really reliable retrieve as well as the correct and humane use of the electronic collar as a training tool in field work and general obedience. Participants will learn through hands on work with their own dogs and demonstrations as we work through teaching the reliable retrieve, as well as the application of e-collars in obedience and field work. If you have been frustrated by your dog not coming when called in the hunting field or on walks, if your dog is dropping birds before returning to the duck blind, or is handling game inappropriately, if your dog is out of control in the hunting field then this workshop will help. You will also learn how to start a puppy or young dog correctly to avoid many of the issues that result from having a disobedient dog in the field. There will be time in the workshop for general problem solving as well. Doug and Anne have over 75 years of hands on experience between them with many different breeds of dogs. In addition to competing with their dogs, Doug and Anne hunt their dogs on waterfowl and upland birds.

Doug Grant got his first hunting dog in 1942; an English Springer Spaniel. He has owned Springers, Vizlas, Weimaraners, Brittany Spaniels, German Shorthair Pointers, Chesapeake and Labradors. He started competing in licensed field trials in 1958, and judged his first Open All-Age stake in 1965. He is a past president of the Labrador Club of Ontario, and the founder of the Okanagan Retriever Club.

Doug started training professionally in 1971, and has trained hundreds of gun dogs, and many Master Hunters and Field trial Champions. Doug retired several years ago, but still enjoys judging, running dogs for friends in trials, and putting on training seminars. Doug particularly enjoys working with young dogs, and helping their owners find solutions to any problems they encounter in their training.

Anne Everett owns and operates Heads Up Kennels in Merville, BC, where she trains and breeds Golden Retrievers. Anne has earned over 100 Master passes on 12 different dogs, 6 WCX titles, 6 UKC HRCH's, 6 UKC UH's, as well as Qualifying field trial wins and Open placements with her dogs.. She has titled 4 Grand Master Hunters in Canada, as well as 10 Master Hunters and a number of Junior and Senior dogs. Anne is a licensed WCX, Hunt Test and Field Trial judge in Canada and is the CKC Field Trial Council Rep for Southern BC.. Anne has also earned CKC OTCH titles on two dogs and has numerous High In Trials in the Obedience Ring. She earned the first OTCH-MH title combination on a Golden Retriever in Canada.

Anne's methods focus on teaching and motivating. She specializes in training puppies and young dogs. Anne recognizes that each dog is different and may require a slightly different training approach. Her methods have a proven track record with a diverse number of breeds including Golden and Labrador Retrievers, Standard Poodles, Flat-Coated Retrievers and Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retrievers.

The workshop will be held at Heads Up Kennels, Merville, BC from 9 – 5 pm Saturday and Sunday –Nov 5/6, 2011. The reliable retrieve workshop is scheduled for Nov 5, the electronic collar workshop will be on Nov 6. Participants will be limited to 12 working handlers each day. Handlers are limited to 2 dogs. The cost for the workshop is \$150/day or \$250 for two days. Registration closes when the workshop fills. No refunds after Oct 15th.
